



How to apply to become a Visiting Student at UBC for a Haida Gwaii Semester and Summer Session

Visiting Student - Students enrolled in a Bachelor degree program at another university or college institution other than UBC are considered visiting students.

This guide is intended to help navigate non-UBC students who wish to register for a Haida Gwaii Institute's Haida Gwaii Semester or Summer Session through the UBC application process to become a Visiting Student at UBC. How to apply

New students

If you're new to UBC, or have previously applied to but not attended UBC, you'll need to create a new student account.

- 1 Create an [Education Planner BC account](#) online.
- 2 Fill in your personal information and academic history.
- 3 Click "Start Applying" and select University of British Columbia as the institution.
- 4 Select the appropriate Admissions Category based on your academic history.
- 5 Select "Visiting Student" under First Program Choice.
- 6 UBC Admissions will email you with a confirmation of your application and next steps.
- 7 After completing your application, email any additional and required documents to non.degree@ubc.ca.



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3. Following the 7 steps listed in the **How to Apply** instructions, after you have created an account and started an application on the Education Planner BC website, under the **Program Selection** section, as indicated in steps 4 and 5, you will "select the appropriate

Admissions Category based on your academic history” and select “Access Studies” under *First Program Choice*, you will also need to choose the following options from the drop-down menus:

- a. Select “UBC Vancouver” Campus
- b. Select applicable session e.g., “2022/2023 Winter Session: September-April”
*Note: If you do not see the term that you are applying for in the drop-down list, select the next closest term, and the application reviewer at UBC admissions will manually change the term when they receive your application.

***Previous students or previously admitted students**, follow the instructions on the “UBC Non-Degree Studies for Visiting Students” webpage (see image below) and include the HGI courses they wish to take in their email.

Previous students or previously admitted students

If you have previously been admitted to **and** registered in courses at UBC, a student record has already been established in the UBC system with your information. Please email non_degree@ubc.ca with the following details to begin your admission process:

- Full name
- UBC student number, if available
- Date of birth
- Your Non-Degree Category, which is “Visiting”
- Intended start date
- Campus preference (Vancouver or Okanagan)

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4. All Visiting Students are required to provide a Letter of Permission issued by their home institution. For HGI course information and syllabus contact Haida Gwaii Institute hg.institute@ubc.ca.

Requirements for the Letter

- The Letter must be typed on official university letterhead or written on an appropriate university form
- You must include a list of all the courses that you wish to take
- You must note the academic session you are applying to (e.g., 2018-2019 Winter or 2019 Summer)
- You must indicate your current bachelor's program and academic standing
- The Letter must be in PDF format

Please have the the issuing office can email the Letter of Permission to non.degree@ubc.ca.

Your Letter of Permission is only valid for one session. You will need to submit a new letter for any subsequent sessions in which you wish to register for courses.
